Safety in a class of its own Protecting people and nature

E xpedition cruises leave no room for experiments – nautical expertise, serious planning, great caution and care are essential to ensure safety and wonderful experiences. Only cruise operators like us who meet the requirements of the Polar Code of the International Maritime Organisation (IMO) and are certified accordingly may travel in polar waters. The specifications comprise ship construction, equipment and qualification of ships

and their crews. For polar expeditions, our expedition ship is constructed in a completely different way to "normal" (cruise) ships – it has thicker steel plates and numerous additional frames at the main ice area of the hull. The ship can move through polar waters for longer periods without stopping for provisions or fuel – for example, on the Northwest Passage. With the highest ice class for passenger ships (PC 6), our expedition ship can push aside the broken pack ice and, if necessary, travel safely through solid ice cover of around 90 cm (35 in.) thick. On our expeditions, we not only adhere to stringent legal provisions, but go beyond these requirements with voluntary measures to protect the regions we visit. Therefore, we completely forgo the use of heavy fuel oil and, since 2020, have exclusively been using marine gas oil with a maximum sulphur content of 0.1 % (LS-MGO).



In 1891, Albert Ballin, who would later become the general director of HAPAG, sent the "Augusta Viktoria" to the Mediterranean with 241 passengers – the birth of the modern cruise. Our expedition ships have completed, for example, 20 journeys through the Northwest Passage, five through the Northeast Passage, five semi-circumnavigations of the Antarctic and even one complete circumnavigation of the Arctic. in remote regions. They'll share their passion for discovering the new and unfamiliar with you. Particularly in the polar regions, they check the route daily, look for even more impressive alternatives and react flexibly to the weather and ice. This expertise has proven to provide the best foundations for expeditions and will take you to places that other ships cannot reach.







The Observation Deck is also built with "foresight" with various observation levels and mounted binoculars. On extraordinary routes, you will experience great pioneering spirit combined with the highest level of comfort. Only the arrival and departure dates are fixed – everything else is expedition in its purest sense.



MORE THAN ICE

Different highlights await you, depending on the duration and timing of your chosen cruise. Each expedition promises a high level of experience – and you decide which one is right for you. Most cruises start and end in Ushuaia, Argentina's southernmost city, which you can reach with a charter flight from Buenos Aires (included in the cruise-only price). If you have a little more time, it's a great idea to organise an individual pre- or post-cruise programme in the Argentinian capital. You can also add a visit to the Iguacu Falls to your Antarctic cruise. Let the following pages inspire you and learn more about the different regions and wildlife of the Antarctic.

EXPEDITIONS IN THE BEST SEASON FOR CRUISING

Cruises to the Antarctic generally run in austral summer – i.e. between November and March – with various highlights. In November, the fauna here is on the cusp of change: whales return and penguins start to mate and build nests. Fresh powder snow covers the landscape, the ice is still pristine, and there are only a few Antarctic travellers. In December, with almost 24 hours of daylight, it's the breeding season of wandering albatrosses and the time when fur seals



grow into adulthood. It is also the breeding season for penguins, whose chicks can be seen everywhere in January alongside fur seal cubs. February and March are the best time for whale watching and dreamy sunsets. Southern giant petrels and Cape petrels use these months to breed, and young penguins become independent from their parents. You can also find more information in our animal calendar on page 55.

EACH REGION IS A World of Adventure



SOUTH ORKNEY ISLANDS

The South Orkney Islands are a lonely, glaciated world of icy wilderness in the Scotia Sea. They are home to chinstrap and Adelie penguins, which can be spotted here. With luck, you'll also see icebergs drifting off the rugged coast. Find out how the polar researchers at the Argentinian Orcadas Station live when you visit by Zodiac, weather permitting (subject to authorisation).



SOUTH GEORGIA

As soon as this subantarctic animal paradise comes into view, mighty glaciers and fjords will captivate you. Bustling colonies of king penguins carpet the coasts and steep slopes. Hundreds of thousands of animals share the island with elephant seals and fur seals, which you can observe from a respectful distance after landing on one of the black shores. You'll keep returning to the footsteps of Sir Ernest Shackleton, who found his final resting place on South Georgia in 1922.





FALKLAND ISLANDS

A dream destination for birdwatchers. The British Overseas Territory is home to over 60 bird species such as the endemic Falkland pipit, as well as striated caracaras, Cape petrels and king cormorants. Blackbrowed albatrosses and wandering albatrosses make skilful use of the wind to sail through the air without flapping their wings. Aside from the birdlife, there are also impressive traces of an eventful history to see. The small island capital Stanley will welcome you with Victorian houses and British charm.



SOUTH SHETLAND ISLANDS AND ANTARCTIC PENINSULA

The South Shetland Islands form a long chain in the ocean. The legendary Elephant Island is where Shackleton's team held out for months. Jagged crags loom fiercely on the horizon and the evening sun casts a delicate pink glow over the snowfields. Only small expedition ships like the HANSEATIC inspiration are able to sail into the flooded caldera of Deception Island. Accompanied by the creaking of the ice, venture onwards to the Antarctic Peninsula. Majestic glaciers and gigantic icebergs glint in Paradise Bay. Another impressive sight awaits in the Lemaire Channel, where mountains up to 1,000 m (3,281 ft) high line the spectacular shipping passage. Look forward to some thrilling moments.



ANTARCTIC CIRCLE

The further south your expedition goes, the harsher and icier the endless world of white appears. The excitement on board will mount as you approach the crossing of the Antarctic Circle. How far can the ship advance? Thick ice fields are a common sight here, the glaciers seem more dominant, and more icebergs drift on the water, creating a very special feeling of pioneering adventure.



ANTARCTIC SOUND AND WEDDELL SEA

A mystical icy world lies in the Antarctic Sound and at the tip of the Antarctic Peninsula. There are new scenes to feast your eyes on and catch on camera every day from the deck and Zodiacs. The numerous tabular icebergs are particularly spectacular and will astound you with their size, shape and colour. In one of the world's most remote and most challenging expedition areas, the tuya (flat-topped) volcano Brown Bluff makes an amazing sight in clear weather, for example. Its brown tuff cliffs towering over 700 m (2,297 ft) tall are a formidable sight rising between two mighty glaciers.



AMAZING WILDLIFE

CHARACTERFUL PENGUINS

They are extremely agile underwater hunters with streamlined bodies and an appetite for krill, fish and squid, but not all penguins are alike. During your expedition, the team of experts will help you to identify the species from their features. For example, the king penguin, which is the second largest of its kind at about 95 cm (37 in.). From neck to tail, its plumage is a silvery grey-blue colour. It should not be confused with its larger relative, the emperor penguin, which lives on the edge of the Antarctic continent on solid sea ice and, with a bit of luck, can be observed on the semi-circumnavigation. The Adelie penguin is also characteristic with its black head, white ring around the eyes and small beak. Or the rockhopper penguin, whose protruding yellow eye feathers give it a highly conspicuous appearance. If a gentoo penguin is around, you won't be able to miss it, due to its loud squawking during the mating season. Look forward to seeing the stars of Antarctica whether in large colonies on wide beaches, where you land at a respectful distance with the Zodiacs, or as they glide off an iceberg into the sea in small groups.



LOUD-VOICED SEALS

The seals will underscore the special experience of your expedition – in the open sea, on ice floes and on beaches. You'll see – and hear – the great diversity of these creatures in the southern polar region. Ashore, elephant seals weighing several tonnes court the females like heroic tenors in an open-air opera. Baby seals on the beach call loudly for their mothers. Meanwhile, the Weddell seals communicate with ethereal underwater sounds in the ultrasonic range.





MAJESTIC WHALES

An enormous body glides gracefully through the water, a deep burst of breath breaking the silence of the polar world. The fluke rises and falls as if in slow motion, but this is no dream – it is an up-close experience of nature that, with a little luck, will be part of your expedition. There is a chance of seeing blue whales, sperm whales, humpback whales and orcas. When the impressive marine mammals surface nearby, the captain will spontaneously change course and allow you to observe them thoroughly from a respectful distance.

DIVERSE SEABIRDS

There are around 275 species of seabird living in the southern polar waters, including king cormorants, petrels and blue-eyed shags. They spend their lives almost entirely on the open sea, where they find food and also sleep. Birds such as the wandering albatross often follow the ship curiously. With a wingspan of over 3 m (9.8 ft), all they need is the wind to sail for kilometres with barely a flap of their wings. In the Antarctic summer – at the time of your expedition – the seabirds come ashore for mating, nest building and breeding.

Where the extremes of nature dictate the route and sudden wildlife sightings require flexible changes of course, every day can only be planned to a certain extent – but is all the more eventful.


hat might an expedition day look like for you? Your morning starts by invigorating your senses. You stand on deck and breathe in the indescribably clear air. Gazing out over the vast, spellbinding scenery, you get an impression of the first early Zodiac landing that lies ahead. After leaving the ship, you venture into a natural backdrop of snow-capped mountains and steep glaciers - a special feeling of reverence and amazement accompanying every turn. The robust expedition rubber boats pass by an iceberg at a respectful distance, just as a group of penguins is getting ready to jump from the sheet of ice into the water. Which one will be the first to take the leap? And what type of penguins are these captivating creatures? How lucky that you can satisfy your hunger for adventure and your thirst for knowledge at the same

time - the experienced experts at your side will broaden your horizons and teach you how to distinguish between the various species from their little tell-tale features. Back on board, you spot a majestic albatross that follows the ship for a while. The experts' lectures also fill you with inspiration. Various topics relating to nature and the animal kingdom, history and science enrich your discoveries, whether exploring Shackleton and his battle to survive in the ice, the glaciology and geology of the Antarctic, or the latest findings about how the sensitive ecosystem affects the planet's weather and magnetic field.

n the afternoon, the sounds of the ice crunching and cracking accompany the expedition ship as your adventure continues and mighty sheets of ice are pushed aside. The deck is your

best vantage point for watching this world of sparkling blue and white. The captain and crew react flexibly to the ice conditions and choose a route with less ice to reach a nearby island, where the Zodiacs take you ashore again. Kitted out with snowshoes, you hike with the experts to a viewpoint where you are struck by the uniqueness of the southern polar region. Is there any more authentic place to learn about the deeds of legendary pioneers? As enormous mountains rise up before you, you feel a growing, deep sense of how small humans are compared to this natural world. Even once you're back on board, you can't take your eyes away from the icebergs drifting proudly in the waters. You reflect on your experiences into the evening with a small group of like-minded travellers and are filled with endless anticipation for what tomorrow will bring.







Active masterclasses

he Antarctic invites active exploration and there are various opportunities to enjoy this on each day of your expedition. Even when you are standing with your experts on the deck tour at the bow at the front of the ship, the majesty and silence of the region awaken your hunger for adventure as you cruise through narrow channels. Zodiac rides off glaciers and vast coastlines are just the "tip of the iceberg", bringing views from an array of different perspectives. Satisfy your thirst for adventure with the many landings by Zodiac. These take you ashore in small groups, where you can see an absolutely unbelievable number of penguins or visit beaches with elephant seals, for instance. It is a humbling experience to watch

them from a respectful distance. Explore the Antarctic from everchanging angles on hikes with your experts. For example, you'll trace the footsteps of historic explorers before your route takes you along the moraines of a majestic glacier and then rewards you with spellbinding views atop the hills. Or embark on a snowshoe hike and get a sense for yourself of what efforts the bygone pioneers went to in order to explore this wonderland. With a bit of luck, you will even spend a night in tents ashore and feel like a polar explorer. Please note: a final decision can only be made on board whether camping can be offered on your cruise (depending on official permits and weather conditions, not included in the cruise price). Experience some-

thing exceptional and learn something new from the great expertise and specialist knowledge shared by the team of experts who are always at your side. They will explain more about what you have seen and be on hand to answer your questions in the Zodiacs, too. What causes the weather phenomenon known as a white-out, where the ground and sky merge into an icy nothingness? Why do icebergs glow green and how do they provide nutrients for the algae? How do trapped air bubbles 3,000 m (9,843 ft) below the surface help us to understand the climate? Whether ashore or on board, during lectures or in the Ocean Academy, our expeditions to the Antarctic offer activities, experiences and knowledge that you will remember forever.

he semi-circumnavigation of the Antarctic is something very special for those in search of an unforgettable expedition. The HANSEATIC inspiration braves this endeavour on an incredible route from South America to New Zealand. The captain and crew flexibly adjust the itinerary to the constantly changing conditions. Towering basalt cliffs, rugged volcanic rock and snowcovered mountains herald an impressive destination: the Antarctic Peninsula. Icebergs, glaciers and majestic mountains - populated by penguins, seals and a huge variety of seabirds. The small, manoeuvrable expedition ship promises unique days. Numerous Zodiac rides and landings heighten the sense of discovery. Stories of pioneers are brought to life on islands, in bays and in seas with names harking back to great explorers. Whether in the footsteps of James Clark Ross, Robert Falcon Scott or Sir Ernest Shackleton - you'll follow their pioneering spirit on your expedition. Depending on the ice and weather conditions, the HANSEATIC inspiration will head to Deception Island. Marvel at the extinct volcano all around you as the ship sails into the centre of the flooded caldera and takes you to the black volcanic beaches. In contrast, the white world of Neko Harbor makes for stunning images: massive glacial cliffs are reflected in the sea. Along wonderful icy panoramas populated by Weddell and fur seals, you will head for Paradise Bay and its drifting icebergs. The feeling of exploration on board soars with each nautical mile - and with it the dimensions of the



landscapes that you can watch in awe whenever you like thanks to the many open deck spaces. Mountains up to 1,000 m (3,281 ft) high flank the narrow Lemaire Channel on one of the world's most beautiful sea passages. Keep an eye out for gentoo and Adelie penguins and the blue-eyed cormorants that have their breeding colonies on Petermann Island. Other ships have long had to turn back at this point, but the HANSEATIC inspiration is able to cross the Antarctic Circle and head for more Antarctic adventures. It is hard to imagine living in this isolation as a scientist, but the remains of a hut and a plaque at the cape of Prospect Point serve as reminders that some once did.

W ith the highest ice class for passenger ships, the HANSEATIC inspiration can forge its way to the most beautiful and rarely visited regions such as Marguerite Bay and a British research station dating back to the 1960s: on Stonington Island, you will discover how skuas and Antarctic terns have taken possession of the abandoned base. The following days at sea will be shaped not only by fascinating expert presentations on board, but also by the golden age of Antarctic research as the HANSEATIC inspiration cruises in the Bellingshausen Sea, Amundsen Sea and Ross Sea. These seas take their names from the daring explorers who boarded their vessels many years ago to travel this remote region without modern technology, putting their lives on the line – and they may well have been just as impressed as you are by similar views.

ANTARCTICA



t is the ideal season and the timing is perfect - can the HANSEATIC inspiration make its way through the pack ice and drifting ice to get to Ross Island? Will the weather and ice conditions allow us to land in legendary places such as Cape Royds? The spot where Sir Ernest Shackleton built a base camp for his South Pole expedition in 1908 is now home to penguins. Cape Evans, by contrast, set the scene for the Terra Nova expedition led by Robert Falcon Scott, who never returned from his attempt to beat Roald Amundsen to the South Pole. The American McMurdo Station will also bring polar history to life (subject to authorisation). In the shadow of the modern building and the mighty Mount Erebus stands the Discovery hut built by Scott in 1902. A good ten years later, it also played an important part in Shackleton's Endurance expedition





as a base camp for the planned crossing of Antarctica. Perhaps you'll spot emperor penguins and whales in this historically significant region. Another indescribable highlight awaits as you cruise in front of the fantastic backdrop of the Ross Ice Shelf: the gigantic wall of ice as tall as houses stretches for hundreds of kilometres. Next, Victoria Land welcomes you with an endless expanse in Terra Nova Bay, named after the ship that Scott was sailing in when he discovered the bay in 1901. The features here now include an Italian research station. In Cape Adare, you will find the ruins of a hut that Borchgrevink built in 1899 and in which an expedition team spent a winter in Antarctica for the first time. The spectacular natural surroundings are just as moving as the region's past - including the largest colony of Adelie penguins in Antarctica with over 250,000 breeding pairs.

s your route continues, you will come across untouched A island worlds with a rich fauna that are hardly known in our latitudes. With a small circle of like-minded people, the goal is to discover these paradises and develop a special awareness and appreciation for them. Nature conservation is playing an increasingly important role in their preservation, which is why permits are becoming more and more complex. Destinations in New Zealand and Australia, for example, depend on whether the authorities grant their permission to cruise and land. If they do, you'll enjoy mystical views of the largely glaciated Balleny Islands and can look out for king and royal penguins as well as fur seals as you cruise off Macquarie Island. Which of New Zealand's subantarctic islands will a landing be successful on? With a bit of luck, you will experience Campbell Island and the world's largest breeding colony of southern royal albatrosses. The Auckland Islands have the lushest flora of all the islands - yellow-eyed penguins and New Zealand sea lions are native here. The Snares penguin, meanwhile, is only found on the Snares Islands, alongside Cape petrels and albatrosses. By making this semi-circumnavigation of the Antarctic, you will be one of the few people who have delved deep into the secrets of this remote region.

A arine reserves, desert landscapes and rainforests - the transnational beauty of South America's Pacific coast is what makes this expedition so unique. On board the HANSEATIC inspiration, you will set course for small islands, foreign cultures and exotic flora and fauna: the daytime passage through the Panama Canal provides an extraordinary kick-off. Gigantic locks, which are some of the world's largest concrete structures, will reveal the past and present of one of the most important waterways in the world. Providing a wealth of exciting facts, your team of on-board experts will enrich your experience as you cruise past savannahs, jungles and mangrove forests. Arriving at the Pacific, you will enter the green heart of Panama in the Gulf of San Miguel: traditional boats will take you into the Darien jungle, Central America's largest continuous rainforest. Meet the Embera people here and get to know their traditional everyday life. Utria National Park in Colombia most likely features the world's highest biodiversity-its 5 km (3.1 mi.) long bay, Ensenada de Utria, serves as a unique refuge for marine animals. A wooden walkway leads around 800 m (2,624 ft) through the mangrove swamp, providing insights that change with the tides. The highlights of a challenging jungle hike with rangers include anteaters, howler monkeys, sloths and hummingbirds - just some of the species that live here.

n the 16th century, Sir Francis Drake went on a privateering expedition in the Pacific waters. He is said to have hidden a silver treasure on the Isla de la Plata in Ecuador – well guarded to this day by turkey vultures and lava lizards.

The Spanish port city of Paita was the target of pirate attacks in the same century. The enormous sea lions of Isla Lobos de Tierra have been hunting underwater for generations. If the authorities grant permission, the Zodiacs will take you ashore, where you may be able to watch pelicans and blue-footed boobies. Near Salaverry, the Chimu civilisation comes to life. Explore the Huaca Dragon Temple and the ruins of Chan Chan*, built around 1300 and arguably the largest archaeological site on the continent. Even older relics can be found in the Moche Valley*, with the Pyramid of the Sun and the Pyramid of the Moon, constructed using millions of adobe bricks and decorated with detailed friezes. The explorer in you will be awed by fascinating natural history when cruising off the Islas Guanape and cruising off the Islas Grupo de Huaura. Your Zodiac rides here are auided by respect for the sensitive nature. The Humboldt penguins on the rocky islands are joined by seabirds such as Guanay cormorants and Peruvian boobies. Perhaps you will be rewarded with glimpses of whales surfacing? From South America's most important trading port, Callao, you will delve into fascinating chapters in the country's history. Explore Lima, the capital of Peru*, which was founded in 1535 by the Spanish conquistador Francisco Pizarro. The fascinating "City of Kings" has a lively atmosphere, surprising contrasts and monasteries from colonial times. As you visit the temple ruins*, modern urban architecture contrasts with a remnant of Peru's oldest culture: the sacred burial temple of Huaca Huallamarca from the sixth century. The Paracas Peninsula, South America's largest marine reserve, offers a wealth of natural treasures.



Take a boat trip to the lively Islas Ballestas*, teeming with seabirds and seals. A flight over the mysterious lines of Nazca* reveals an enigma. The geometric figures and monumental animal images in the desert are over 2,000 years old and a UNESCO World Heritage Site. The history of South American winegrowers and their worldfamous products is reflected in Peru's national drinks: pisco and wine*. Your thirst for knowledge and adventure will also be satisfied by Isla Pan de Azucar - a kind of large sandy mountain. The "sugarloaf island" will treat your eyes to the sight of Peruvian pelicans on your last Zodiac ride on this expedition. After these exciting impressions of your five-country adventure, you will experience a relaxing day at sea before the HANSEATIC inspiration reaches Valparaiso.








Expedition Chilean fjords 20 Nov - 5 Dec 2024 · 15 days PRIMEVAL MAZE AT THE FND OF THF WORI D

here several tectonic plates meet, Chile's northern and southern fjords were created over millions of years. Only with a small expedition ship like the HANSEATIC inspiration can this labyrinth of water be experienced particularly intensively. Captain and crew choose fascinating passages through the vast network of fjords. Framed by gigantic glaciers and mighty granite mountains, awe-inspiring natural wonders and spectacular wildlife lie before you at the end of the world - hidden treasures just waiting for you to discover them. Each expedition day promises new, unique impressions. The charming town of Puerto Montt, surrounded by snow-covered volcanoes, marks the beginning. The Petrohue waterfalls and the Osorno volcano*, with its snow-covered cone, show you the sublime natural phenomena surrounding the people who live here. A kayak tour in the La Poza lagoon* takes you to the home of mock elms and kingfishers. German roots characterise Puerto Varas and Frutillar*: apart from the renowned Teatro del Lago, even Black Forest gateau is a sign of German-Chilean partnership. Chaiten shows how life is determined by the forces of nature. In 2008, the town fell victim to the volcano of the same name a climb to the volcano* will take you right to the edge of the caldera. Alternatively, on a hike in Parque Pumalin*, you can explore the rainforest with giant cypresses. While cruising intensively through the northern fjords, you will enjoy the best views on the inspiration Walk and the ship's many open deck areas. The picturesque route to Caleta





Tortel – connected by kilometre-long walkways made of cypress wood – is truly something special. With less than 90 inhabitants, Puerto Eden reveals how idyllic it is to live in a village on the shore. From this point onwards, the following days will revolve around glaciers. The excitement mounts as the nautically demanding manoeuvres lead to spectacular scenes, including the passing of the Pio XI Glacier. Marvel at one of South America's biggest ice masses with its bizarre craggy surface sparkling in blue and white.

he Calvo and Amalia Glaciers rise up in the heart of Chile's southern fjords before the HANSEATIC inspiration once again proves its expedition capability as it undertakes the passage through the Kirke Narrows. The small, manoeuvrable ship masters the 100 m (328 ft) narrow passage to Puerto Natales with flying colours. The port city can often only be reached by plane, but on board the ship you are surrounded by nature and may even spot dolphins, whales and seals. Once there, a hike up Cerro Dorotea* into the mountains or a horseback ride through the Patagonian pampas* will treat you to views off the beaten track. One of Chile's highlights is the Torres del Paine National Park*, with mountains reaching 3,000 m (9,843 ft) at their peak. Over 100 different animal species, including rheas, flamingos and Andean condors, live between rushing waterfalls, extensive forests and shimmering aquamarine mountain lakes. A trek to the Base Las Torres* offers the opportunity to observe the natural surroundings in a sporty way. Travelling in the wake of the first person to circumnavigate the globe, you will reach the seldom-visited Tucker Islands as you cruise through the Strait of Magellan. They are the ideal expedition territory for an exciting Zodiac ride, where you can keep a lookout for Magellanic penguins and cormorants. The pioneering spirit of the golden age of seafaring can be felt at the end of the world in Punta Arenas. From there, a hike through Magallanes National Reserve* will take you into a world of diverse flora. The fauna, on the other hand, is the focus of the boat trip

to the penguin colony on Isla Magdalena*. Thousands of penguins congregate here at this time of year. Alternatively, keep an eye out for Chile's national bird during condor watching*. Cruising off the Garibaldi Glacier with its blue, shimmering tongue of ice and cruising through the Beagle Channel with a passage through "Glacier Alley" both reveal the beauty of nature in all its glory – a spectacular highlight and, at the same time, the crowning glory that rounds off this cruise.



ceania between majestic drama and idyllic grace and you on a small expedition ship right in the middle of it. There are regions that you will tell stories about and be inspired by for a lifetime. New Zealand is one of them. On a spectacular route, the HANSEATIC inspiration combines classic highlights with lesser-known insider tips, enriched by island gems of New Caledonia. Fiordland National Park on the South Island is the prelude to your adventure. From the poetry of nature to the poetry of Dunedin. Open up the pages of the UNESCO City of Literature individually or come along to the Otago Peninsula*, which is home to royal albatrosses and yellow-eyed penguins. Alternatively, look at the amazing diversity of the landscape passing you by on a train ride with the Taieri Gorge Railway* as you cross magnificent stone and cast-iron viaducts and bridges. The historic town of Akaroa in the heart of a flooded volcano is full of French flair. Soak up the savoir vivre as you visit one of the small cafes and take a stroll

with a view of sailing boats and green hills. When cruising in Queen Charlotte Sound, the inspiration Walk and the glass balconies become your front-row seats for the natural spectacle of broad mountain ranges and dense coastal vegetation. Heading out from Picton, you can get active whether on a hike along a stretch of the Queen Charlotte Track* or on a kayak tour*. You will discover the home of one of the most famous Sauvignon Blancs in the world on a visit to the Cloudy Bay vineyard*.


n the North Island, New Zealand's capital Wellington welcomes you, surrounded by green hills. Make the most of your time individually or on a culinary tour* - with delicious specialities such as pavlova. Gain insights into the native bird life of the kakas and takahe in the Kapiti Island Nature Reserve*. From the small coastal suburb of Mount Maunganui, Rotorua, New Zealand's thermal region* demonstrates the power of the earth's core. Bubbling pools, steaming fissures and colourful lakes - a truly cinematic backdrop. Talking of cinema, an alternative scenic tour to The Shire* takes you to the home of the Hobbits. Auckland, the "City of Sails", presents New Zealand's urban lifestyle. Whether you opt for "pure nature" around Auckland* or climb the Harbour Bridge*, remarkable outdoor activities are guaranteed here as well.

he Bay of Islands will help you understand the close connection that the New Zealanders have with the sea. Small subtropical islands with white beaches in the turquoise water create an amazing labyrinth. There are









few more thrilling ways to explore this island realm than a helicopter flight* or a kayak tour through the mangroves*. Bays, green meadows and steep cliffs: if the weather permits a landing on remote Norfolk Island, you can take in the impressions of nature in the former convict colony. The Zodiacs will also be in action on the coasts of New Caledonia. On Lifou, for example, where the original life of the islanders is fascinating. 



Each destination has its very own magic - a mix of eventful history and present times - like the island nation of Vanuatu. Here, you will experience a picture-perfect start on Espiritu Santo with its white Champagne Beach, inviting you to relax and go snorkelling.

iscovering the new and unfamiliar in the vastness of the Pacific also means spending time at sea, because the unknown places are far from familiar shores. On such days at sea, knowledge and enjoyment can be deepened in wonderful ways. The team of experts provides fascinating background information, and you can also relax and enjoy the comfort and service on board. When the ship drops anchor in the crystal-clear Pacific off Butaritari, you will enjoy a magical welcome as locals greet you with traditional ceremonies and dances. It is hardly possible to emphasise a single highlight among the many dream destinations on this expedition. No matter which turquoise lagoons and small bays the Zodiacs take you to - when you set foot on the Marshall Islands, you will feel like Robinson Crusoe. The widely scattered atolls and over 1,000 islands are still undiscovered by tourists today. Rare species, mysterious rituals, lush jungle: tropical worlds far from our times - like Mili Atoll,

home to sea turtles and coconut crabs. American administration as a trust territory had a strong influence on life on Majuro Atoll. Jaluit Atoll gives a sense of total isolation - while it has only around 11 km² (4.2 mi.²) of land, its lagoon spans almost 700 km² (270 mi.²). Many of the remote Caroline Islands cannot even be located on a map. This part of the Pacific is almost forgotten by the world today, but your experts know a lot about the former colonial influence, the turmoil of two world wars and the indigenous flora and fauna. Kosrae is a gem comprising jungle and mangroves - dominated by a volcano in the centre that is more than 600 m (1,968 ft) high. The second-largest of the Caroline Islands, Pohnpei, will definitely exceed your expectations of nature as well. The landscape is characterised by jagged mountains covered in rainforest and over 40 rivers running down from the highlands. A visit to the ancient ruined city of Nan Madol*, shrouded in mysticism and built on more than 90 man-made islands, will lead you into the heart of lush vegetation. Ulul is one of the many coral islands on this expedition that receive few foreign visitors and invite you to while away some time. The friendly inhabitants of the untouched island of Lamotrek will transport you to another world with their traditional dances.

V ap is also extremely remote, an island on which people lead highly traditional and simple lives. On a scenic tour*, marvel at the round stone money banks in front of the houses or take a kayak tour through the mangroves* to explore an undisturbed ecosystem. What's it like to live in isolation on an islet? The Zodiacs give you rare glimpses. Meet the only human living on Ngulu Atoll or enjoy this idyllic setting as you swim and go snorkelling. The "Floating Garden" of Palau is a dream world. Many tiny islands emerge from the blue-green ocean like mushrooms covered in plant life. To allow you to immerse yourself in this wonder in peace, the HANSEATIC inspiration will stay two days. Plenty of time, for example, to take a boat trip through the Rock Islands* or a guided snorkelling tour*. Bizarre limestone cliffs are overgrown with thick vegetation and a colourful diversity of species lives in shimmering coral. On a scenic flight over the island world*, you will see this paradise from a completely different perspective. The future of many Pacific islands is uncertain; just a few metres above sea level, they are in danger as sea levels rise. This makes the unforgettable experiences with the HANSEATIC inspiration all the more valuable.

Unknown Japan and South Korea · 22 May – 9 Jun 2025 · 18 days A MEETING OF OPPOSITES IN THE FAR EAST

here tradition and modernity go hand in hand and tranquillity meets vibrancy, the HANSEATIC inspiration combines Japan's South Sea Islands, the rarely visited west coast and Hokkaido in the far north for the first time. A new land of smiles is the Nansei Islands right at the start of your cruise. Lush green islands with white sandy beaches and the scent of flowers bring to mind Hawaii or Bora Bora - and this is how Miyakojima welcomes you. Turguoise sea and insights into the salt-harvesting industry characterise your island impressions*. This idyll gives way to the vibrant lifestyle of Naha. You can discover the capital of the Okinawa Islands from a culinary perspective on a "Taste of Okinawa" cookery course*. The Nakagusuku Castle ruins* are one of the many monuments on the island and a legacy of the Ryukyu Kingdom, which ruled the region between the 15th and 19th centuries. Solitude and untouched nature characterise Yoron-Shima. Depending on the conditions, the Zodiacs might also be used here. Lush cedar forest, which has been declared a UNESCO World Heritage Site, awaits you on Yakushima. When trekking in the cloud forest*, rhododendrons, mosses and lichens appear particularly mystical, accompanied by the sounds of numerous species of bird as well as macaques.

A ncient dynasties and eventful world history lie close together on Japan's south coast. Visited for the first time and surrounded by mountain ranges, Uwajima will take you back to the Edo period with its historic castle. Explore cultural Uwajima* in the footsteps of the Date clan who once ruled the area. The spa city of Beppu lets you immerse yourself in traditional bathing rituals on a visit to an onsen* with hot thermal water. A special expression of Japan's religion are the more than 60 stone buddhas in Usuki*, made around 1,000 years ago. Hiroshima symbolises a very eventful period in modern history. The witness to global history* excursion will touch on the tragic events of 1945 and take you to the Peace Memorial Park, designed by star architect Kenzo Tange. The picturesque coastal landscapes of the sacred island of Miyajima have inspired both art and literature. After landing, you will discover the red Itsukushima Shrine at your own pace on an individual stroll. On a detour to South Korea from Busan, the UNESCO World Heritage Site Gyeongju* brings the ancient Silla dynasty to life, while a coastal walk through Igidae Park* with its small suspension bridges reveals Korea's close relationship with nature.

B ack in Japan, you will uncover secrets of culture and nature along the rarely visited west coast that remain hidden from most travellers. First, Karatsu tells of the Japanese world as you explore the coastal resort. Both geology and the remote location have created a very special ecosystem on the Oki Islands, characterised by red rock formations and green vegetation. Get active here on a hike along the Kuniga Coast*. Just like a "crane spreading its wings" – which is what the name of this harbour means – your understanding of Far East belief systems will unfold in Maizuru. From here, you will travel to the spiritual centre of the country: Kyoto – the old imperial city* with its myriad temples and extravagantly decorated shrines. Or devote

yourself to a natural experience on the "bridge to heaven"*, one of Japan's most beautiful landscapes. Architectural charm is an inherent part of Kanazawa, with its old geisha and samurai houses and the Kenroku-en Garden and tea district*, which perfectly combines a spacious setting with craftsmanship and tradition. Sado Island has a long history of unusual fishing boats: small and oval, like rice bowls. In the coastal town of Oqi, the rhythm is determined not through the beat of oars, but with a traditional taiko drumming class*. The mines of the gold island of Sado* are a special source of precious metals. The wealth of Japan's north coast, by contrast, lies in the heritage of the ancient warrior caste in Akita. The origins of the Kanto festival and the samurai district in Kakunodate* reveal colourful traditions. Alternatively, the sprawling coast and mystical Namahage culture form a fascinating symbiosis on an excursion to the Oga Peninsula*. The northern island of Hokkaido is also a natural beauty. From Hakodate, your attention turns to the birds and vegetation of Onuma Quasi-National Park*. By the time your Far East adventure comes to an end, you will agree with Buddha's maxim: it is better to travel well than to arrive.



Expedition Kamchatka, Kuril Islands and Aleutian Islands PRIMEVAL WORLD OF THE RING OF FIRE

he nature of the Pacific Ring of Fire is filled with a rarely seen power and grace. On its spectacular route from Asia to Alaska, the HANSEATIC inspiration reveals surprising and unfamiliar worlds every day, kicking off with the discovery of the Japanese volcanic island of Rishiri. The island of Sakhalin in the Sea of Okhotsk marks the border between Japan and Russia. Korsakov is steeped in history: there used to be a penal colony here, which gained literary notoriety thanks to Anton Chekhov. Tyuleny sheds exciting light on the lives of countless fur seals and Steller sea lions. The Kuril Islands extend over 1,200 km (746 mi.) in the Pacific Ocean. Overgrown mountain peaks shimmer through the mist. Spray thunders against steep cliffs. The landscape will take your breath away - for example, when you reach the interior of the steep caldera on Yankicho by Zodiac, weather permitting. The highest volcano of the Kuril Islands rises up on Atlasova. The kelp forests of the Ptichiy Islands, where you might be able to spot seals and sea otters, provide a fascinating contrast.

M ighty volcanoes, geysers and great forests: Kamchatka offers a landscape of monumental dimensions. Your route is adjusted daily according to the weather and the expected sightings – so that you can land at Tikhirka Bay, for example, and discover the stunning natural scenery. The Zodiacs even turn the Chazma salmon river into expedition territory. Will the shy Kamchatka brown bear put in an appearance here? Keep a constant lookout for bears and Steller's sea eagles – for instance, at the mouth of the Zhupanova River. Two days are set aside for intensive discoveries of the spectacular volcanic landscape in Petropavlovsk. To marvel at the archaic environment from a bird's-eye view, take off on a helicopter flight to the Valley of the Geysers*, which formed 20,000 years ago. This UNESCO World Heritage Site is shaped by columns of water that shoot up every minute and steaming sulphur springs. The flight to Nalychevo Nature Park* also promises breathtaking panoramas and the opportunity to bathe in the wilderness upon arrival. A hike up the Avacha volcano* will reward you with fantastic views of the dramatic landscape.

t the point where the North American Plate and the A Pacific Plate meet, you will explore one of the most fascinating expedition territories of all time: the Aleutian Islands. Experience the exceptional beauty of the island chain in the Bering Sea fully from the many open deck spaces or on exciting shore visits. Marvel at the seabird colonies cruising off Kiska Island from the inspiration Walk at the bow, for example. Go ashore with your experts to trace the history of Adak Island – a former military base that is now practically a ghost town. 

here are still pages to be filled in the chronicle of the far north – it's up to you to continue the story. Add your own chapter to the annals of a waterway that has been both a legend and a daring feat for centuries: the Northwest Passage. Legendary pioneers wrote history here, and Hapag-Lloyd Cruises is adding a new pioneering feat to it. For the first time ever, two ships of our new expedition class are sailing the route at the same time in opposite directions. n 1906, Roald Amundsen navigated the entire Northwest Passage for the first time. Now you can tackle this pioneering feat yourself on board the HANSEATIC inspiration. The first chapter of your adventurous weeks start on the coast of the Alaska Peninsula. As you cruise off Kak Island, the cliffs teeming with birds will stir up your anticipation of what lies ahead. Chignik means "strong wind" in the Alutiiq language. Gain an insight into life in this small fishing town, which has around 80 residents. The volcanic island chain of the Aleutian Islands stretches into the Pacific like a great arc. Here you'll visit Popof Island, where bison roam the land and bald eagles rule the skies. Your gaze will instinctively be drawn upwards when you hear their call above Unalaska Island. The settlers in Dutch Harbor looked



to the heavens for different reasons, as can been seen from the oldest Russian Orthodox church in North America with its white towers topped with onion domes. A colony of northern fur seals might welcome you as you hike with your experts on Saint Paul Island - a taste of the intensive encounters that await you with the diverse fauna of this remote region. As you cruise through the Bering Sea, keep a lookout for whales from the excellent vantage point offered by the many open deck spaces. Just like rich experiences have drawn you to this region, it was gold that was the magnet in Alaska in the early 1900s. The town of Nome is still shaped by the gold rush of bygone times, with disused steam trains, tracks and gold dredges. The excitement on board grows as you cruise through Chukchi Sea and Beaufort Sea and draw nearer to the lifelong dream and magnet for countless adventurers and explorers ...

he adventure of the Northwest Passage: to this day, fascinating legends surround this famous waterway. The manoeuvrable HANSEATIC inspiration is perfect for navigating safely through these regions, which are extremely challenging to sail. Enjoy an exceptionally up-close experience of the fascinating Arctic with the highest ice class for passenger ships and the experienced expedition crew. Although the route is carefully planned, the weather and ice often determine the actual course, with the captain and crew adjusting the details each day. To start your adventures, the rarely visited Herschel Island sets the scene. If the local conditions permit, you can explore the former whaling station. With a little luck, rough-legged buzzards will herald your arrival and the timid Arctic fox might even make an appearance. Franklin Bay is enveloped by the history of Franklin the explorer and the phenomenon of the Smoking Hills. The smoky effect is caused by layers of rocks within the hills that contain pyrite and have ignited themselves. A Zodiac ride offers unique perspectives of this mystical spectacle.

O n Victoria Island, named after the British queen, you might have the chance to see mighty musk oxen weighing up to 400 kg (882 lb). Will you perhaps even see polar bears here? Look forward to amazing insights into the way of life and history of the Inuit. For centuries, the area around Cambridge Bay was the summer meeting point for the "Copper Eskimo" families – named after their copper tools. The wreck of Roald Amundsen's research ship Maud bore silent witness to his bravery from its resting place in the ice here for around 90 years before being taken back to Norway in 2018. Depending on the ice as well as the local conditions, you will witness a historic moment: the meeting of the HANSEATIC inspiration and the HANSEATIC spirit expedition ships. The extraordinary rendezvous will be





celebrated on deck and, according to old nautical custom, be accompanied by the sounding of the ship horns. A great voice echoes on Jenny Lind Island, which owes its name to a Swedish opera singer from the 19th century lovingly known as the "nightingale". You may find yourself surprised by four-legged residents such as Arctic hares, Arctic foxes and caribou.

 Λ s the ship cruises in Victoria Strait, the dramatic scenery will reflect the moving history of this area. For a long time, the lost ships of the Franklin expedition, which tried and failed to find the Northwest Passage in 1845, were thought to be at the entrance to the strait. One of them, the Terror, was discovered in 2016 in Terror Bay, around 100 km (62 mi.) further south than expected. Find out about the fate and the unflinching courage of those who braved the forces of nature back then from your experts on board. The conditions will decide whether your adventure continues by cruising in Peel Sound - the ice sets the pace as the HANSEATIC inspiration manoeuvres safely through the island labyrinth to its next destinations. Very few ships are capable of this feat, which requires first-class equipment and an experienced crew. Zodiac rides and landings are possible throughout the habitat of whales, seals and polar bears. For example, Prince of Wales Island invites you to hike through the untouched nature. Follow in the footsteps of past explorers on Beechey Island. A walk to the graves of members of the Franklin expedition will bring its historic significance to the fore. The world's largest uninhabited island, Devon Island, welcomes you with its vast wilderness. An abandoned station of the Royal Canadian Mounted Police reinforces the impression of remote silence. As the ship then sets sail from Lancaster Sound for Greenland, you'll have completed the feat and be among the few people who can say they have conquered the Northwest Passage.

The final chapter in your adventure takes you along the west coast of Greenland. Small but perfectly formed, Uummannaq nestles at the foot of a spectacular heartshaped mountain. The splendid Jakobshavn Glacier near Ilulissat is the "birthplace" of around 10% of Greenland's icebergs. Marvel at the glistening ice masses that gather here with a hike to the ice fjord. This is followed by an amazing natural spectacle: in the glittering splendour of Disko Bay, mighty icebergs drift majestically through the water – an event that you can watch unfold around you from the deck and in a Zodiac. Sisimiut provides an atmospheric end to your expedition, with its houses dotted across several hills. Almost an entire month filled with milestones of seafaring history lies behind you now – the experiences of a lifetime and wonderful memories will stay with you for years to come.

W hat is life like in the Greenland Arctic and along Canada's most famous river? Encounter the wonders of nature in the vast expanse - topped off with an adventure through the locks. The world's largest island provides the prologue to your expedition. The HANSEATIC inspiration begins its expedition route in Sisimiut on the west coast of Greenland. Follow in the footsteps of the Saggag culture and visit the old town, which resembles a museum village. 

Idyllic bays, deep-green forests and limestone coastlines will leave you with lasting memories as you explore the Bruce Trail at your own pace. The small HANSEATIC inspiration is in its element as it charts a course through a scenic labyrinth of water to reach Parry Sound. Explore the town and the nearby lake shore on the marine walking trails or take a boat trip of the Thirty Thousand



Islands*. The varied archipelago scenery is filled with islands emerging from the water, narrow channels and imposing cliffs. Alternatively, you can turn your focus to unforgettable panoramic pictures in Killbear Provincial Park*, where pink granite banks and autumnal forest blend to create majestic scenery. The islands around Killarney are a crown jewel in wild nature - unspoilt nature that harks back to the time of the first trappers. This El Dorado for nature lovers is best explored individually. Your adventure continues with an exciting lock passage through the Sault Ste. Marie Canal. As the largest lock system in the world, the Soo Locks are a masterpiece of engineering. Built around 150 years ago, huge container ships can master the change in height of around 6 m (20 ft) between Lake Huron and Lake Superior - as can the small HANSEATIC inspiration, with you as an observer of the manoeuvres on deck.

n Lake Superior, Canada's Thunder Bay welcomes you with spectacular coastal landscapes. Marvel at the "Niagara Falls of the north", where the water plunges down around 40 m (131 ft), when you visit historic Fort William and the Kakabeka Falls*. A hiking adventure in Sleeping Giant Provincial Park* will have you climbing a flat-topped mountain ridge with dramatic granite cliffs. Cruising along the northern shore of Lake Superior, you can relax and enjoy the panoramic view or learn interesting details about the First Nations from the team of experts on board before your small ship passes the locks again at Sault Ste. Marie. Next, in-depth insights into the city's history await you. Sault Ste. Marie is not only divided by a river, but also by the state border between Canada and the US. Mackinac Island is considered one of the most beautiful islands in the US. Discover Victorian mansions and the 19th-century Grand Hotel on foot, by bike and on a horse-drawn carriage ride. In the 19th century, Fayette drove industrialisation with one of the most productive iron smelters at the time. If the authorities grant permission, you can learn more about what it was like working at the blast furnaces and about life in the historic wooden buildings. By the time you reach Lake Michigan, your personal American dream will have come true in Milwaukee.

Contrast this with your view of the skyline of the former "Motor City" in Windsor - witnessing the transformation of Detroit* is exciting. This is followed by a cruise on Lake Erie and truly great experiences ...





he next stage of your cruise is all about nautical masterpieces: follow the challenging passage during a lock adventure on the Welland Canal on the deck tour at the bow or the ship's many open deck areas. Through eight locks, your small ship overcomes almost 100 m (328 ft) of height, corresponding to a lock lift the height of Niagara Falls. This is only possible thanks to the ship's retractable bridge wings. In Toronto, a city tour by tram* shows how skyscrapers, parks and trendy districts complement each other well. Your curiosity will know no bounds on the next experience: a lock adventure on the St Lawrence River with knowledgeable commentary provided from the bridge. Enjoy the exciting manoeuvres in the seven locks from the deck. European charm welcomes you in Montreal on a city tour*. The sommelier in you, by contrast, will be awakened by the wineries in the Eastern Townships*. French savoir vivre and Canadian zest for life invite you to explore the historic guarter in Quebec. A walking tour with tea at Chateau Frontenac* will bring around 400 years of history to life. On a trip to Montmorency Falls and Ile d'Orleans*, you will pass some of Canada's oldest French settlements. Dive deeper into the settlers' history in Canada's oldest village, Tadoussac. With a little luck, you might also spot whales here. A population of belugas lives in the waters all year round. From Gaspe, picturesque bays and rocky coastline shape your impressions on a scenic tour across the peninsula and to Forillon National Park*. You can also explore this paradise for amateur ornithologists on an active hike* amidst autumnal colours. On the lles de la Madeleine, red cliffs and long sandy beaches provide breathtaking island impressions*. Alternatively, a culinary tour* combines cheese, fish and the art of brewing. Finally, Charlottetown on Prince Edward Island welcomes you to an urban idyll where the sound of horse-drawn carriages echoes through the streets. As your cruise slowly draws to a close, your American-Canadian dream comes to an end in beautiful natural surroundings.
